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

Importance of Committees and Agendas

It is the aim of MUNs to provide a platform for the youth to not only understand crucial global issues but also actively participate in deliberations to chalk out solutions for these problems. So the SPMMUN with its three committees endeavors to initiate great academic debates on extremely relevant issues.

The agenda that the **Disarmament and International Security Committee** has taken up is “International cooperation in peaceful uses of outer space”. From 1950, Space became a dramatic arena for competition as each side, i.e. the USSR and the USA, try to prove their superiority in technology and military firepower. Fuelled by growing arms race and the threat of nuclear weapons, wide-ranging espionage and counter-espionage between countries, war in Korea, Cuban Missile Crisis and outbreak of war in Southeast Asia, these tensions exacerbated the space race. To counteract these devastating effects, “The Committee on the Peaceful Uses of Outer Space (COPUOS)” was tasked with reviewing international cooperation in peaceful uses of outer space, studying space-related activities that could be undertaken by the United Nations, encouraging space research programmes, and studying legal problems arising from the exploration of outer space.

The agenda for SPMMUN’ 15 **United Nation Security Council (UNSC)** is the rise of Islamic fundamentalist organizations and the threat they pose to the concept of states and democracy and how can this issue be curbed. Today the linkages of various terror groups like Boko Haram, ISIS, DAESH, Al Qaeda etc. has resulted in their realization of their dream of a Caliphate and now threaten international peace and security rather than just being mere domestic actors in their area of operations. Boko Haram is an ideal example as it shows how a mere youth group protesting against western civilization can emerge as a major terror organization. Thus this issue needs the global platform that UNSC has provided. The need for international coordination in checking cross border terrorist movements, countering illicit movement of arms and aiding the humanitarian causes to eradicate this threat cannot be stressed enough.

Due to modernization and technological advancements the very nature of armed conflict has revolutionized; war has become more lethal, with greater casualties and gross violations of human rights. In the midst of such terror and fear the **United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC)** stands as a beacon of hope to come up with solutions to deal with this situation. Acts of gender based violence prevailing in modern day armed conflicts and assaults on women are now a major corner voiced out in global platforms. Women become major victims as systematic rapes with the intent of ethnic cleansing through deliberate impregnation are becoming a growing problem. What is also alarming that in today’s world the lines between lawful and unlawful warfare are phenomenally blurred thus civilians and combatants that inevitably drawn to the same field of violence and assault. Thus the UNHRC’s role in ensuring that the International humanitarian law is adhered and relief is given to civilians is crucial.
