THE COMMITTEE

THE SECURITY COUNCIL

Security Council is the most important in the world given the legitimacy by international community to act when needed to resolve the world's most pressing issues. Rise of the Islamic State in the Middle East is one of them. A symmetric warfare, which includes non-state actors (NSAs), is one of the most disruptive threats to the modern nation system in the Middle East. The insurgent group of Sunni Muslim Jihadis, ISIL (Islamic State of Iraq and Levant) tops the list. In June 2014 they formally declared the establishment of a caliphate- a state governed in accordance with Islamic law. To establish their control in Iraq, they crossed the Syrian border where they had already been fighting to gain control. Syria has literally botched to control its territory and has become a Launchpad for ISIL. Led by Abu Bakr Al Baghdadi, it has become notorious for its brutality, mass killings and beheadings. The group has attracted Muslims elsewhere in the world and a US led coalition has vowed to destroy it. The group has welcomed the prospect of direct confrontation with the US led coalition, viewing it as a harbinger of an end-of-times showdown between Muslims and their enemies described in Islamic apocalyptic prophecies.

Human Rights Council

"All victims of human rights abuses should be able to look to the Human Rights Council as a forum and a springboard for action." Racial discrimination is an exigent problem which exists all across the globe. It is a complication experienced by minority communities and it also violates a basic human right: right to equality. This problem has been created by society itself which affects the thought process of young and impressionable minds. Xenophobia is very closely related to racial discrimination. It is the dislike or fear of people from other nations who are termed as 'foreigners'. Most non-citizens are engaged in doing menial jobs. Acts are termed xenophobic when the purpose of these acts is to humiliate, hurt or attack a certain person or community which is alien. If a large part of the population of the world adopts the ideals of xenophobia, it can become the cause of international political turfs which can lead to bloodshed. Eradication of racism is very important for the equal social status of all people so that we live in a society which is peaceful and full of harmony. By doing this we can reduce the number of crimes and terrorist activities. Thus, elimination of racism is a top priority for the world. Therefore the Human Rights Council takes up this pertinent issue for its discussion and plans to bring out the most plausible solutions during the conference.

The Committee

<u>The European Union (EU)</u>

The European Union (EU) is a politico-economic union of 28 member states that are located primarily in Europe. It operates through a hybrid system of supranational and intergovernmental decision-making. Initially created for the purpose of binding the members countries together to make them interdependent on each other economically so as to prevent further conflict among them, it has since then expanded into a vast organization with policy areas spanning from development to environment aid. The EU has developed an internal single market through a standardized system of laws that apply in all member states. 'Euro-zone Migrant Crisis with Special Emphasis on the Socio-Economic Status of Migrants in European Nations' is the agenda that will be discussed in the committee. It will focus on the treatment of migrants in Europe by the EU and its member states. Europe is experiencing one of the most significant influxes of migrants and refugees in its history. Pushed by civil war and terror and pulled by the promise of a better life, huge numbers of people have fled the Middle East and Africa, risking their lives along the way. The EU has come under heavy fire for failure to establish a universal standard for asylum and top UN officials have expressed deep concern with forcible returns of migrants and the creation of barriers to prevent entry into countries in Europe. The response of the committee and its members to the allegations of violations of Human Rights and the highly unsatisfactory response to the Migrant crisis will be the main focus of the committee.

United Nations General Assembly DISEC

The UNGA First Committee deals with disarmament, global challenges and threats to peace that affect the international community and seeks out solutions to the challenges in the international security regime. It considers all disarmament and international security matters within the scope of the Charter or relating to the powers and functions of any other organ of the United Nations; the general principles of cooperation in the maintenance of international peace and security, as well as principles governing disarmament and the regulation of armaments; promotion of cooperative arrangements and measures aimed at strengthening stability through lower levels of armaments. For the first agenda the Executive Board has chosen to provide a crisp summary of the agenda touching upon the important thematic elements. A legal overview has been provided so as to acquaint delegates with the burning international divisions the resolution of which will be critical to enable any progress on the agenda. With regard to the second agenda the resolution of legal issues is quite secondary to resolving more basic political questions such as the role of the UN and the position of states with regard to it. Therefore an overview of UN Peacekeeping mission as it exists has been provided before presenting the many alternatives available to the present system which place more permanent military formations at the UN's disposal.

The Committee

<u>All India Political Party's Meet</u>

All India Political Party's meet is a meeting which gets together to discuss issues of national importance. According to the constitution of India, the basic fundamental rights given to all citizens of India is the freedom of speech however this right is contradicted by the Sedition Law. The Sedition Law states that whoever by words either spoken or written or by signs or visible representation or otherwise brings or attempts to bring into hatred or contempt or excites or attempts to excite disaffection including disloyalty and all feelings of hate towards the government established by law in India shall be punished by life imprisonment. This law was established in India by the British in 1870 by Lord Thomas Macaulay. In the light of recent events in the February of 2016, the student union president of JNO University, Kanhaiya Kumar was arrested on charges of sedition under section 124-A of India Penal code. This arrest raised a political riot the country with marches and protests being organized by activists and academicians against the move made by the government. While those associated with JNU, past and present feel that the government is stifling and ruthlessly suppressing dissent. Another part of population believes that JNU for long has been supporting and exciting anti national slogans and activities and the students involved must be punished. Both sides continued protesting. On 2 March, 2016 videos supporting the act were proven to be fake and Kanhaiya Kumar was released after spending three weeks in prison. Hence, the committee would deliberate and discuss over the issue and chalk out viable solutions to curb the plagued problem.
